Course Description: The goal of this lab is provide a hands-on approach that will supplement the content material from lecture. During labs, we will be observing live and preserved specimens, as well as performing experiments. We will begin the semester by studying the major systems using fetal pig dissections. Animal behavior and reproduction will follow organ systems. Finally, two field trips will accompany a lab for the ecology section of this course.

Materials: S. Mader, Inquiry into Life (manual), 10th edition. Please bring your lab manual to every class. Gloves, goggles, and dissection kit are available at the bookstore and must be brought to lab as instructed.

Grading: A total of 150 points will be available during the semester. These points will come from 2 lab quizzes (25pts each) and 2 lab practical exams (50 pts each). Quizzes will be given at beginning of each lab and new material will be introduced after the test, so *do not be late*! Practical exams will be given during a set lab period and take approximately 1 hour to complete, after which you may leave. During practical exam labs there will stations set up and you will be given 1min 30sec to answer the question at each station. No make-ups will be given for missed practical exams due to set-up issues!
