I have also included the title of what is considered (at least in the U.S.) as the foremost scholarly historical work on this period by MacFarquhar and Schoenhals.

Finally, for those of you who are new to Facing History & Ourselves, we will be sending you separately some information on how to register for an online seminar (or you may wish to sign up for a face-to-face experience in one of our regions) in order for you to join our network of teachers.

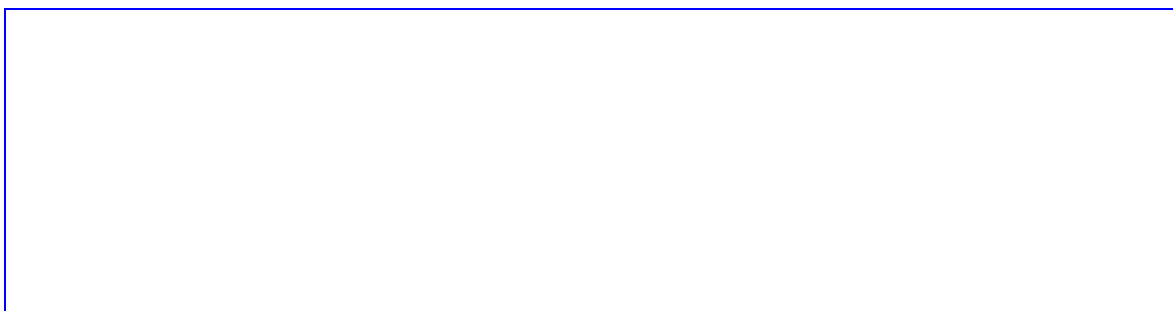
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
