Task

1. Read Chapter 1 and consider the following questions.

- ❖ What is the motive of Columbus to travel to east Indies (Asia)? Who sponsored his expedition?
- ❖ Did Columbus discover North America? Please explain.
- Please describe the Arawak/Taino people.
- ❖ How do we/historians know about them if their history was mostly carried in oral forms?
- ❖ Please use examples from both the 13 English colonies and the Spanish colonies to explain the phrases "Total control led to total cruelty (Zinn, 2003, p. 6)
- ❖ Are there any Taino people today? http://www.indigenouspeople.net/taino.htm

2. **Practice Lesson Plan Writing** using the Lesson Plan Template
