APA Format and In-text Citation: What if there are more than six authors

General Info

The entry should begin with the last name of the first author, followed by his or her initials. Date of publication comes next, in parentheses. The title should be italicized, but only the first word should be capitalized. Place of publication comes next, then the publisher. Use a colon after the place of publication. Each portion of the entry should be separated by a period and two spaces.

In Text citation

Citing multiple authors in text

- For a work with two authors: Cite both author's last names at every reference.
- For a work with three, four, or five authors: Cite the all author's last names at first reference, thereafter only cite the first author's last name followed by "et al."
- For a work with six or more authors: Cite only the last name of the first author followed by "et al."

Reference List

For one to six authors, list all. For seven or more, list the first six followed by a comma and et al.

Examples:

Festinger, L., Riecken, H., & Schachter, S. (1956). *When prophecy fails*. Minneapolis: University of Minnesota Press.

Wolchik, S.A., West, S.G., Sandler, I.N., Tein, J., Coatsworth, D., Lengua, L., et al. (2000). An experimental evaluation of theory-based mother and mother-child programs for children of divorce. *Journal of Consulting and Clinical Psychology*, 68, 843-856.
